Consider and Take Appropriate Action on Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 232, <u>General Certification</u> <u>Provisions</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Certificate Renewal and</u> <u>Continuing Professional Education Requirements</u>, §232.11, <u>Number and Content of Required Continuing Professional</u> <u>Education Hours</u>

DISCUSSION AND ACTION

SUMMARY: This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) an opportunity to discuss and propose an amendment to 19 TAC Chapter 232, <u>General</u> <u>Certification Provisions</u>, Subchapter A, <u>Certificate Renewal and Continuing Professional</u> <u>Education Requirements</u>, §232.11, <u>Number and Content of Required Continuing Professional</u> <u>Education Hours</u>. The proposed amendment would implement changes resulting from the 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017, which include adding new continuing professional education (CPE) topics for all educators. The proposed amendment would also add minimum requirements for several CPE topics for individuals holding standard classroom teacher, principal, and school counselor certificates.

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: The statutory authority for 19 TAC Chapter 232, Subchapter A, is the Texas Education Code (TEC), §§21.003(a); 21.0031(f); 21.031; 21.041(b)(1), (4), and (9); 21.0543, as added by Senate Bill (SB) 1839, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017; and 21.054, as amended by SB 7, SB 179, and SB 1839, 85th Texas Legislature, Regular Session, 2017.

 - (B) career opportunities.
- (g) The board shall adopt rules that allow an educator to fulfill up to 12 hours of continuing education by participating in a mental health first aid training program offered by a local mental health authority under Section 1001.203, Health and Safety Code. The number of hours of continuing education an educator may fulfill under this subsection may not exceed the number of hours the educator actually spends participating in a mental health first aid training program.

Text of Proposed Amendment to 19 TAC

Chapter 232. General Certification Provisions

Subchapter A. Certificate Renewal and Continuing Professional Education Requirements

§232.11. Number and Content of Required Continuing Professional Education Hours.

- (a) The appropriate number of clothours of continuing professional education (CPE), as specified in §232.13 of this title (relating to Number of Required Continuing Professional Education Hours by Classes of Certificates), must be completed during each-firearrenewal period.
- (b) One semester credit hour earned at an accredited institution of higher education is equivalent to 15 CPE clock-hours.
- (c) At least 80% of the CPE activities shall be directly related to the certificate(s) being renewed and focus on the standards required for the initial issuance of the certificate(s), including:
 - (1) content area knowledge and skills;
 - (2) professional ethics and standards of conduct;
 - (3) professional development, which should encompass topics such as the following:
 - (A) district and campus priorities and objectives;
 - (B)

[(iv) students at risk of dropping out of school.

- (E) educating studentsho are educationally disadvantaged;
- (F) educating English language learners;
- (G) educating students at risk of dropping out of school; and
- (H) understanding appropriate relationships, boundaries, and communications between educators and students.
- (5) <u>An individual who holds a principal certificate that is renewed on or after June 1, 2019</u>, must <u>complete CPE activities directly related to each of the topics listed in subparagrations of the paragraph</u>Not more than 25% of the CPE activities for an vindual who holds principal <u>certificate</u>shall include instruction in the following topi

- (d) Educators are encouraged to identify CPE activities based ots refshils or her annual appraisal required under the <u>TE(Texas Education Co</u>de], Chapter 21, Subchapter H.
- (e) The required CPE for educators who teach students with dyslexia must include training regarding new research and practices in educating studeits dyslexia. The required training may be satisfied through an online course approved by Texas Education Agency staff.
- (f) An educator eligible to renew multiple classes of certificates issued during the same renewal period may satisfy the requirements specified in §232.13 of this title for any class of certificate issued for less than the full five-year period by completing a prorated number of the required CPE-totours. Educators must complete a minimum of ontieth of the additional CPE clockoursfor each full calendar year that the additional class of certificate is valid.
- (g) An educator may fulfill up to 12 clockours of required CPE activities by participating in a mental health first aid training program offered by a local mental health aritighunder the Texas Health and Safety Code, §1001.203. The number of clockours of CPE an educator may fulfill under this subsection may not exceed the number of clockours the educator actually spends participating in a mental health first aid training program.
- (h) An educator may receive credit toward CPE requirements for completion of an instructional course on the use of an automated external defibrillator (AED) that meets the guidelines for AED training approved under Texas Health and Safety Code, §779.002, in accordance with the Education Code (TEC)], §21.0541.
- (i) An educator may receive credit toward CPE requirements for completion of suicide prevention training that meets the guidelines for suicide prevention training approved under the TEC, §21.451.
- (j) Continuing education requirements for a classroom teacher and principal may include instruction regarding
