## Consideration of Petition for Adoption of Rule Change Concerning 19 TAC Chapter 250, Administration, Subchapter B, Rulemaking Procedures

#### DISCUSSION AND ACTION

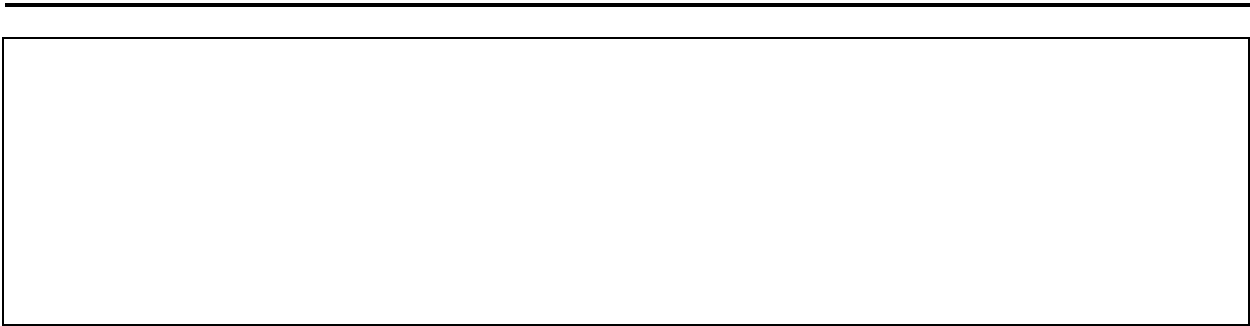
Te. **PREVIOUS BOARD ACTION:** The SBEC last amended this chapter in July 2021. This item provides the State Board for Educator Certification (SBEC) an opportunity to consider a petition for rulemaking regarding 19 Texas Administrative Code (TAC) Chapter 250, Administration, Subchapter B, Rulemaking Procedures, filed pursuant to Texas Government Code, §2001.021. **BACKGROUND INFORMATION AND JUSTIFICATION:** The SBEC's rules in 19 TAC Chapter 250, Administration, Subchapter B, Rulemaking Procedures, set out the requirements for interested persons to petition the SBEC for the adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule. The petitioner requests the addition of 19 TAC §250.30, Rational Rulemaking. The SBEC must either deny the petition or direct the Texas Education Agency (TEA) staff to initiate rulemaking proceedings.

In accordance with the Texas Government Code, §2001.021, the SBEC shall deny the petition or direct the TEA staff to initiate rulemaking proceedings.

The table below summarizes the content of the petitioner's requests.

Petition to Adopt 19 TAC 250.30(a)

Report the methodology, data, and results of the calculations of the fiscal impact required by Texas Government Code, §2001.0045 of the proposed changes to the rules to the SBEC as part of the agenda aligned with other fiscal impact.             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. If TEA staff claim a change is required for the health, safety, or welfare of students (Texas Government Code, §2004.5(c)(6), they must specify the bodily injury, medical condition, or measurable welfare outcome that will be prevented by the change.</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Identify the anticipated impact of the rule in measurable, verifiable, meaningful terms.             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Example: "Increase grades 5 math scores by xx%; Reduce teacher attrition by candidates."</li> </ol> </li> <li>3. Specify the time when the anticipated impact will manifest (e.g., June 2024).</li> <li>4. Specify the standards by which the rule change will be judged successful or unsuccessful.</li> </ol>
