Sixtysix percent of participants felt there were frequent opportunities to collaborate with related service providers and almost seventeen percent felt there were not frequent opportunities to collaboratewith serviceproviders.

All respondents agreed there were no obstacles concerning student's special education programming and services.

All participants agree with the importance of including students' interests/life goals in the transition processwith 66% of participants strongly agreeing.

All participants indicated they chose the Pherson learning model. They reported that remote learningfor students receiving specialed ucation was somewhat in effective to extremely ineffective.

COVID

Almost 67% of participants felt that during COVID school closure/remote learning, the Emergency ContingencyPlanwas effectiven student progress.

During COVID closures the top three methods teachers used to provide support to students with moderate severed is abilities were:

- Teachersprovidedsupportsneededfor studentsto be successful.
- Teachersmodified work.
- Teachers made regular contact with students and parents to meet academic and emotional needs.
