The Grow Your Own grant will provide teacher stipends for two education and training teachers and cover CTSO dues and competition fees for current chapters of TAFE and FCCLA. Students have the opportunity to earn an associates degree in Teaching through our partnering IHE, Lee College. The 2024-25 school year will be the first year we implement dual credit into Instructional Practices with

Goal 1: To build a strong, diverse teacher pipeline for Goose Creek CISD through the continued implementation of the Career Academy for Future Educators and participation in the CCRSM network as a PTECH campus.
Strategies: promote non-traditional enrollment by use of photos in high school options booklet, Future Teacher Signing Day, mock interviews, internships, educational aide certifications, associate degree in teaching/dual credit offerings
Goal 2: 10% of cohort 2026 Career Academy for Future Educators (1st PTECH cohort) will earn an associates degree in teaching.
Strategies: counselor works with students on 4 year plans, students given opportunities to take dual credit courses during the summer, TSIA preparation starting as early as before freshmen year
Goal 3: 100% of Career Academy for Future Educators students who meet qualifications for Educational Aide Certification will complete certification by August 2026.
Qualifications: 18 years old, must pass 2 or more courses for 3 or more credits in Teaching and Training program of study, must have SSN and valid ID to get fingerprinted.
