During the 2015 accountability development cycle, the ATAO ecommended the creation of an integrated diplomaplan indicator that combined the RHSP/DAR nd FHSP diplomaplans into one calculation beginning with the class of 2015. Beginning with class of 2018, the diplomaplan indicator would be solely based on the FHSP.

(7) one credit in fine arts under Section 28.002(a)(2)(D) and

(b r2) In adopting rules under Subsectior(b r1),the StateBoard of Educationshall provide for a student to comply with

(1) if the studentreceivesspecialeducationservicesunderSubchapterA,Chapter29,the student'sadmission_review,and dismissabommittee;

(2) if the studentdoesnot receivespecialeducationservicesunderSubchapteA, Chapter 29, but is covered by Section504, RehabilitationAct of 1973 (29 U.S.C.Section794), the committee established or the student under that Act; or

(3) if each of the committees described by Subdivisions(1) and (2) is inapplicable, a committee established by the school district of persons with appropriate knowledge regarding the student.

(b r13)In adoptingrules under Subsection (b r1) the StateBoard of Educations hallallow a student to substitute credit in another appropriate course for the second credit in the same language in a language other than English otherwise required by Subsection (b r1) (5) f the student, in completing the first credit required under Subsection (b r1) (5) demonstrates that the student is unlikely to be able to complete the second credit. The board rules must establish:

(1) the standardsand, as applicable, the appropriate school personnel for making a determination under this subsection and

(2) appropriate substitute courses for purposes of this subsection.

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(b r14)In adoptingrules under Subsection (b r1) the StateBoardof Educations hallallow a student who, due to disability, is unable to complete two courses in the same language in a language other than English, as provided under Subsection (b r1)(5), to substitute for those credits two credits in English language arts, mathematics, science, or social studies or two credits in career and technology education, technology applications, or other academice lectives. A credit allowed to be substituted under this subsection may not also be used by the student to satisfy a graduation credit requirement other than credit for completion of a language other than English. The rules must provide that the determination regarding a student's ability to participate in language other rthan English courses will be made by:

(1) if the student receive specialed ucation services under SubchapterA, Chapter 29, the student's admission review, and dismiss a committee; or

(2) if the studentdoesnot receivespecialeducationservicesunderSubchapteA, Chapter 29, but is covered by Section504, RehabilitationAct of 1973 (29 U.S.C.Section794), the committee established or the student under that Act.

(b r 16) A student may satisfy an elective credit required under Subsectior(b f)(6) with a credit earned to satisfy the additional curriculum requirements for the distinguished evel of achievement under the foundation high school program or an endorse ment under Subsection (c r 1). This subsection may apply to more than one elective credit.

(br17) The State Board of Educations hall adopt rules to ensure that a student may comply with the curriculum requirements under Subsection (br1) (6) by successfully completing an advanced career and technical course, including a course that may lead to an industry rrecognized redential or certificate or an associated egree.
