

TREx Version 2.5 – New Features
Released 03/26/08

TREx v 2.5 is a maintenance release intended to address some of the errors in the original release of the application. It includes the following changes:

1. Attachments can be opened and viewed before accepting a student record or transcript.
2. Student records and transcripts can be viewed and printed independently.
3. Improved error messages for file upload and data validation.
4. The graduation seal watermark has improved resolution and has been moved to the upper right hand corner of transcript.
5. The PID Search results screen masks all but the last 4 digits of the Social Security Number.
6. The PID Search results screen now displays the requesting campus if the student is already enrolled. (The PID database only contains the last school attended. To view enrollment history, use the PID Enrollment Tracking (PET) function in EDIT+).
7. Campus Awarding Credit no longer returns an error if the campus is no longer active.
8. Graduation Program Type is required for the final transcript. However, files will no longer fail to upload if this field is not populated.
9. The Withdrawal Reason Code is required only for students in grades 7 – 12.
10. A new Withdrawal Reason Code '99' has been added for students moving from one district to another.

Added code 5 – Student is on track to complete the portion of the recommended graduation program that is available to the student at a high school that certifies to the commissioner of education that not all the necessary courses for the recommended program were offered (TEC §§51.803(d)(2) and 56.304(f)(1))

Code 5 will allow districts to meet the requirements of TEC §51.803(d).

Removed code 4 – Student is exempt from requirement to complete at least the SBOE approved Recommended High School Program

12. The following new Special Explanation code has been added to support been added to support a new AAR Minimum Standards currently under development. They will not be used by the school districts until the new AAR Minimum Standards take effect, which is expected to occur beginning with the freshman class of the 2008 – 2009 school year.
